7. **General Business**

- a. Parking on the pavement alongside Kingsmead was again brought to the council by concerned residents. Drivers coming out onto the main road are unable to see oncoming traffic as these cars are obstructing their view. This problem has been discussed several times but no resolution yet found. Police advice is being sought.
- b. Concern has also been raised about a vehicle parked in West St.
- c. The parish notice board has been taken down with a view to renovation, it was found to be beyond this and a new one is being planned.

8. **Any Other Business**

- a. The pathway at Grovely Cottages was again raised as an issue and this is to be followed up.
- b. The council is to approach the Oak Apple Club to see if it can assist in an April meeting in the village
- c. Speeding is still an issue despite the 20mph signs. The council is looking into lighted warning signs that could help to slow traffic.
- d. The church clock is still not working, Cumbria Clocks will be contacted to see what is causing the hold up.
- e. The Parish Council is pleased to see the sympathetic rebuild of the chimneys at our community asset The Royal Oak. These Chimneys have looked unsafe for many years and this work is very welcome.
